

UNIFORM GUIDELINES

College Uniform

School uniform is compulsory and all students are expected to take pride in their appearance and grooming. The uniform is not a fashion accessory but a means of publicly demonstrating the community to which you belong.

Our Uniform has four core pillars:

FUNCTIONAL

Comfortable clothes that support movement with material to meet our regional climate.

SMART & MODERN

Reflective of today's needs and into the future.

AFFORDABLE

Balancing quality and cost.

RECOGNISABLE

Allowing our students to have a sense of pride as ambassadors of the College in the local community.



FEATURES OF THE VICTORY UNIFORM

TRANS-SEASONAL

There is no designated winter or summer uniform. Students wear the appropriate uniform for their year level and may choose to dress for comfort and weather at any time of year.

Formal and Sport uniforms are separate and transseasonal but are not to be mixed and matched.

INTERCHANGEABLE

There are many options to create personalised combinations of uniform. From pants, skorts, shorts, shirts and a dress, students can select uniform items that suit their personal style and preference.

ONE SPORT UNIFORM FOR ALL

There is no separate sport uniforms for Primary and Secondary, with the exception of leggings which can be worn in Years 7-12. Sports uniforms are only to be worn on allocated sports days (Please check the year level pages on Cirrus).

TRANSITION PERIOD

The transition period in which the old uniform can be worn by current students will end at the conclusion of the 2024 school year.

All students new to Victory will be required to wear the new uniform.

Important Guidelines

EXTRA WARMTH

For extra warmth, students may elect to wear:

- A plain white singlet or t-shirt under the school or sport shirt but should not be seen from outside the uniform. No other colours are permissible.
- The College beanie and/or scarf.
- Navy tights.

In all cases, the extra layer may be worn for extra warmth but is NOT to replace the College jumper/windcheater/jacket/blazer.

HAIR

Whilst the College recognises that hairstyles are a matter of individual style and taste, we ask that hair is clean, neat and tidy and is to be worn away from the face. If hair is shoulder length it must be tied up completely.

Hair is considered shoulder length when it reaches the lowest part of the collar.

Hairstyles will not draw unnecessary attention to individuals and will be keeping with the broader Uniform Guidelines.

Hair accessories are to be College colours only - red, navy, white and black.

Facial hair is permitted for Years 11 & 12 students but must remain closely shaved/cropped, maximum length of blade #2.

Any students considering changing their hairstyle or hair colour and are doubtful as to how it would be accepted at the College, should seek approval from the appropriate Head of School beforehand.

HAT

Victory is a SunSmart school. During Terms 1 & 4, the College maintains a 'No Hat, No Play' Policy and all students are required to wear a hat whilst outside during breaks and outdoor lessons.

During Terms 2 & 3, it is not compulsory for students to wear their hats during breaks or outdoor lessons.

Hats are required at school all year round, although they are not used as often during Terms 2 & 3 when the cap can be worn (Years 7-12 students only).

Any excursion or situation where there will be prolonged exposure to the sun, students will be instructed to wear the bucket hat (not the cap or beanie).

ALL hats need to be clearly named because the hat will be taken off at times.

Hats and College beanies are not to be worn indoors.

JEWELLERY

A plain light chain with a small cross may be worn around the neck.

A maximum of two simple plain gold/silver studs or sleepers may be worn in the ear.

Students may wear one small, discreet nose stud (not a ring or anything else).

Students with eyebrow, lip or other visual piercings may only wear clear plastic retainers, not jewellery.

Bracelets/anklets and rings are not permitted for safety reasons, with the exception of Medic Alert bracelets/necklaces.

MAKE UP AND NAIL POLISH

No make-up is to be worn by our Primary students while Secondary students (Years 7 -12) may wear light foundation / tinted moisturiser, preferably with 30+ sunblock rating and light mascara. A natural look must be maintained.

Clear nail polish is permitted.

SUNGLASSES

Appropriate sunglasses approved by the Cancer Council may be worn during recess and lunch breaks, but not in class. They may also be permitted on approved excursions but remain the responsibility of the students at all times.

TATTOOS

Visible tattoos are not permitted at the College at any time.

Shoes & Socks

FORMAL SHOES

Our Formal uniform requires the compulsory wearing of polishable, black leather school shoes with no coloured markings and a flat/sensible sized heel:

- FOUNDATION YEAR 2: may wear velcro instead of lace up shoes until students are able to tie their own laces.
- YEARS 3 12: must wear lace-up shoes.
- OPTIONAL FOR PRIMARY STUDENTS: Black sandals without socks.

SPORT SHOES

Our Sport uniform requires the compulsory wearing of a suitable running, court or cross-training shoe. No skate, canvas or volley-style shoes are permitted.

SOCKS

Plain navy or plain white above ankle socks must be worn with either the Formal or Sport uniform.

For extra warmth dark navy tights can be worn with the formal uniform, available from the Uniform Shop.







Noone Uniform Shop

There is a Uniform Shop based at Victory Lutheran College in the Wirraway building for families to purchase uniform items. This is the sole uniform retail outlet (except for socks and shoes) and is managed by our supplier, Noone.

There will be individual appointments for new families and the Uniform Shop will have dedicated staff to assist.

The Uniform Shop is closed Tuesdays and Thursdays.
